What is Probus?

It's an association of retired and semi-retired people who join together in clubs, for the basic purpose to provide regular opportunities for members to keep minds active, expand interests and enjoy the fellowship of friends and associates.

The emphasis is on clubs being simple in structure and free from the constraints and obligations of Service Clubs involving members in minimum costs. The prime objective is to provide the opportunity for ongoing fellowship and the sharing of common interests

Probus provides you with the opportunity to join together in Clubs and to progress healthy minds and active bodies through social interaction and activities with retirees in your community.

Probus opens the door to new experiences and friendship. You can hear wonderful guest speakers, stay active by participating in a wide range of activities and explore your community, your country or the world.

Probus offers a range of member benefits and to quote a recent Probus Club member "the day I joined my Probus Club, I instantly had 100 new friends".

How did Probus originate?

In 1965, Fred Carnhill, a member of the Rotary Club of Welwyn Garden City Club UK., formed "The Campus Club", a group of friends and colleagues who met regularly in the centre of the town. Later in 1966, the first "Probus" (Professional and Business) club was formed by Rotarian Harold Blanchard of the Rotary Club of Caterham, UK.

In Australia/New Zealand:

The first NZ Probus club was Probus Club of Kapiti Coast initiated by Rotary Club of Paraparamu, in1974. In 1976, Rotarian Cliff Johnstone from Rotary Club of Hunters Hill NSW, discovered Probus on a visit to Wellington NZ, and upon his return initiated the Probus Club of Hunters Hill.

In the Blue Mountains:

Probus commenced in the Blue Mountains when this club (The Probus Club of the Upper Blue Mountains), was sponsored by the Rotary Clubs of Katoomba and Central Blue Mountains on 22 May 1981.

The first Committee meeting was held on 24th May 1981 and our Charter was presented at a dinner meeting held at the Paragon Restaurant, Katoomba on the 17th June 1981 with 43 Founding Members in attendance.

On the 8th July 1981 the committee decided to commission a "No Smoking" sign to display at our meetings. Our first bus outing was to Warragamba Dam on the 10th August 1981. The bus, from Mountain Devil Bus Company cost \$145 for the day.

Our Foundation President, Paul Neilson, held office until March 1986 and remained active on the committee until November 1999. He was Tours Officer for all that time and also held other positions including that of Secretary

We became the 54th Probus Club in the South Pacific Region and became incorporated on 18 November 1985.

In our region: (Australia /NZ) there are 1700 clubs and in our District 9685 there are 176 clubs and 14.800 members.

Probus Clubs are not Service Organisations and are non-sectarian and non-political. However, many members are active volunteers in many community organisations.

Clubs provide social occasions, schedule guest speakers to inform and entertain members and provide information on local and community events.

Within the club, interest groups are formed to cover hobbies/interests such as sports, entertainment, tours, travel, music, discussion and bushwalking along with dinner and social outings.
